

Commercial Collection Guide | 2024







This guide includes tips and resources to improve your garbage, recycle, and yard+food waste collection services at your business. Others have found it easy to achieve success using these resources. Remember, we're here to help!

Service Highlights

CONTAINER COLORS & SIZES

- All garbage containers are grey. All yard+food waste containers are green. All recycle containers are blue.
- Contact us if you need to change sizes or service frequency.

RECYCLING REMINDER

 Paper cartons (milk or juice), shredded paper, and plastic bags should all go in the garbage. See page 3 for a complete recycling guide. Contact us for additional recycling flyers.

Keep Enclosures Clean

- Ensure adequate garbage and recycling service so material doesn't get left on the ground.
- Area around containers must be clear of materials (extra bags or bulky items) for collection.
- Close container lids to deter pests and keep rainwater from entering your container.
- Request free replacement of damaged WM containers.
- · Encourage staff to flatten boxes.

Unlimited Recycling Service

• Each business is allowed unlimited, weekly recycle collection in carts, and up to three times per week in dumpsters (1-8yd sizes).

Blocked Containers or **Contaminated** Recycling

- WM maintains a "Haul or Call" policy for collection.
- We ask customers to keep containers unblocked (parked cars, overflow material, locked gates, etc.) so that we can empty and replace them in a timely fashion.
- If a driver finds the container blocked or contains contamination, dispatch will be notified.
- Driver will wait up to 4 minutes for container access before moving on with the route.
- If Dispatch reaches the customer, they will ask the customer to clear access or remove the contamination and arrange for later collection if necessary. Extra service charges may apply.
- If Dispatch is unable to contact the customer, they will leave a message explaining the circumstances, and ask the customer to call Customer Service to schedule another collection. Extra service charges may apply.

RECYCLING



Place only clean, dry, and loose items (as listed below) in your blue recycling container. Collected every week.

Metal

ALUMINUM & TIN CANS

Place lids in can, crimp the can shut. Labels ok.

SCRAP METAL

Small, non-working metal appliances, pots, tools, etc. Limit 2' x 2' x 2', 35lbs; no wood, plastic, or rubber attachments; no sharp metal.

Glass

BOTTLES & JARS

Only bottles and jars (no other types or shapes). All colors. Labels OK.

Paper and Cardboard

CLEAN & DRY

INCLUDES: paperback books, catalogs, magazines, dry food boxes (remove plastic liner), non-foil wrapping paper. Flatten all boxes (do not tie up); Maximum size 3'x3'.

Plastic

BOTTLES, JUGS & TUBS

Ignore the numbers, recycle plastics by shape!

RECYCLING

No plastic bags, garbage bags or "recycling" bags allowed.

Paper cartons (milk or juice) are not recyclable and should be placed in the garbage.

Empty and rinse out all food residue. Labels do not need to be removed.

Ignore the number on plastics-Look at the SHAPE.

Recycle plastic only if it is a bottle, jug or tub.

Extra recycling: If you often generate extra recycle, please call WM to increase your container to the next size.

Recycling needs to be kept in a container and dry.

Your materials are being recycled! All the recyclable items collected will be made into something new.

Recycling

YARD+FOOD WASTE



These go in your **green** yard+food waste container. Collected weekly.

Yard Waste & Plants

INCLUDES: Plants, grass clippings, and weeds. (Remove plastic pots, twine, gardening tape and twist ties).

Leaves, tree branches, and roots. (4' or shorter & less than 4" in diameter).

All debris must fit in cart with lid closed.



Food Waste & Leftovers

All food including, meat, bones, fish, and cheese.

YARD+FOOD TIPS

Gather food scraps

from your kitchen in:

- Paper grocery bag
- Reusable container
- Newspaper
- Approved compostable bag from recyclefood.com

Empty reusable container into the yard+food waste cart frequently, and rinse out.







Extra Yard Waste



(collected for a charge)

If you often generate extra yard waste, additional yard waste carts are offered at a discounted rate. For occasional extra yard waste, place next to yard+food waste cart in any of the following:

- Heavy brown paper yard bags (available at hardware stores)
- 32-gallon cans labeled "Yard Waste" (65 lb. limit)
- Bundles tied with natural twine (4'x2' limit)

Bag these and put them in your grey garbage container. Collected weekly.

Non-Recyclable Plastic

INCLUDES: Styrofoam™ products, plastic plates and cups, caps and lids, plastic utensils, empty prescription vials, diapers, chip bags and candy wrappers.



Non-Recyclable Glass

INCLUDES: Incandescent light bulbs (Fluorescent light bulbs & tubes need special disposable)









Non-Recyclable Paper

INCLUDES: Disposable wipes, hardcover books, foil wrapping paper, coated (shiny) paper plates, facial tissue, shredded paper.









Non-Recyclable Metal

INCLUDES: Caps, lids, empty latex paint cans (dry out paint, remove lids, hardened paint okay), and sharp or greasy metal.













Other Garbage

INCLUDES: Bagged cold ashes,

vacuum bag and dust; bagged

pet waste and cat litter; broken household items, office supplies,

other products.

GARBAGE

Numbers do not matter. If a plastic item is not a bottle, jug or tub, it belongs in the garbage.

Paper cartons (milk or juice) are not recyclable and should be placed in the garbage.



Double bag pet waste, vacuum dust, sawdust and cold ashes.



DO NOT put liquids, yard waste, hazardous waste or recycling in the garbage.

LATEX PAINT

Latex paint cans may be placed in the garbage if paint is solidified. To solidify, mix in cat litter, shredded paper, sawdust, or paint hardener. Once paint is dry, leave the lid off and place in your garbage. Alternatively, PaintCare™ can recycle your paint.


CLOTHING & HOUSEHOLD GOODS

Weather Delays

If weather conditions delay collection, up to twice the regular amount of garbage, recycling, and yard+food waste will be collected at no charge on your next regularly scheduled collection day. Credits will not be issued for delays due to inclement weather.

To receive weather alerts, ensure your phone number is updated in your WM account.

After you receive you first monthly billing, you can update your account preferences at: wm.com/ myaccount.

Holiday Schedule

Collection service is provided on all holidays except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

If your collection day falls on or after these holidays, your scheduled collection will be delayed one day that week. For example, if your regular collection day is Friday, holiday collection will take place on Saturday.

How Slotted Lids Help You Recycle Right



Slotted lid recycling dumpsters are designed to prevent garbage, bagged material and other non-recyclable items from going in the recycling.

The lids are locked shut with a notched slot opening, easily accessible for you to pour in loose bottles, cans and paper while keeping contamination out.
