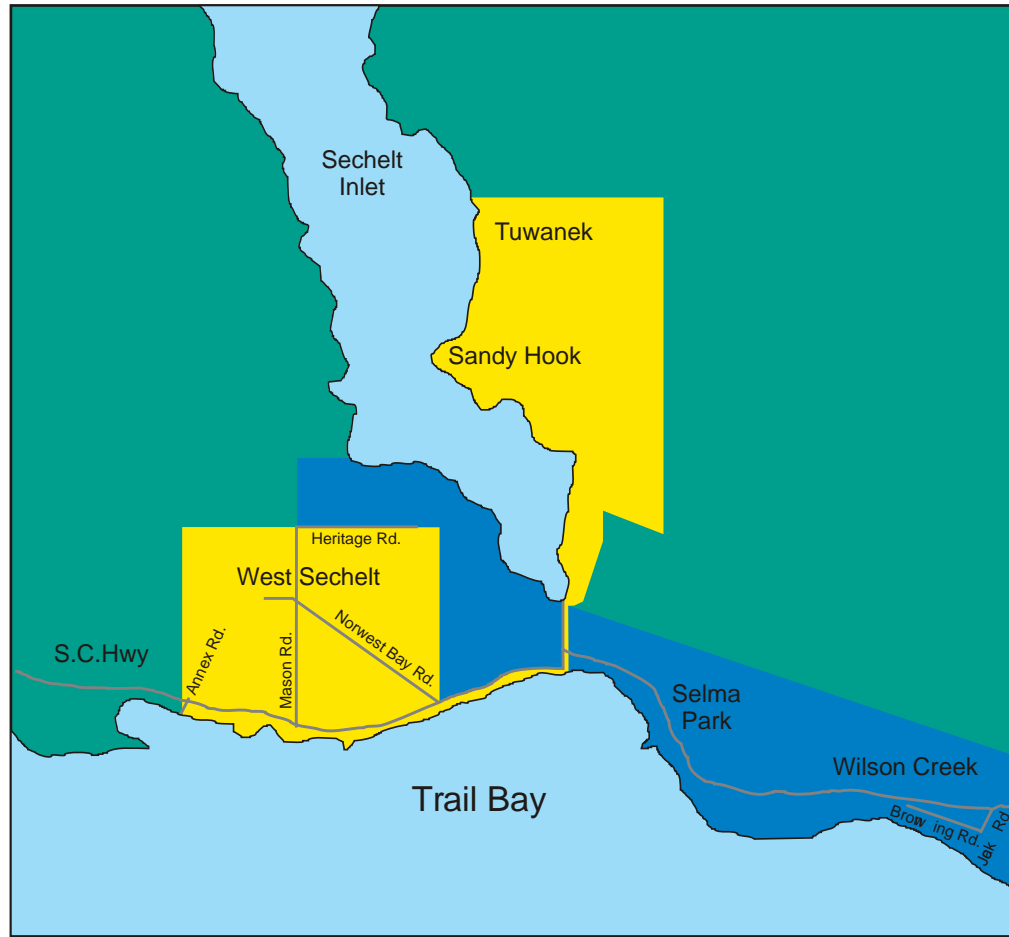

## Residential Garbage and Recycling Guidelines and Schedule

# SETTING OUT YOUR CARTS

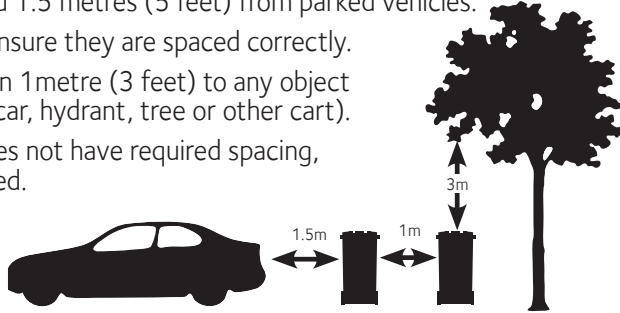
## SET OUT RECYCLING CARTS AND GARBAGE CANS PRIOR TO 8 A.M.

- Place your carts and bins curbside no later than 8:00 a.m. on your collection day.
- Waste service vehicles will not return to a household that has their carts placed out late.



## SPACING

- Ensure at least 1 metre (3 feet) of space around each cart, 3 metres (10 feet) of clearance above the cart and 1.5 metres (5 feet) from parked vehicles.
- If you have multiple carts, ensure they are spaced correctly.
- Never place carts closer than 1 metre (3 feet) to any object (such as a light pole, fence, car, hydrant, tree or other cart).
- If your cart is blocked or does not have required spacing, your cart may not be serviced.



## AT THE CURB

- Place the cart so that it opens toward the street—the arrow on the lid should point toward the centre of the lane or street.
- The wheels of the cart should be against the edge of the curb.

# GARBAGE COLLECTION

## GARBAGE IS COLLECTED WEEKLY

### RESIDENTIAL GARBAGE

- Is limited to ONE STANDARD (80L) GARBAGE CAN PER HOUSEHOLD, no heavier than 20kgs (44lbs)
- Extra cans / bags will require garbage tags
- Extra garbage bag tags can be purchased from the District of Sechelt Municipal Office.
- Make sure the tag is easily visible on the bag / can

## NOT ACCEPTED X

- Recyclables
- Dirt, rocks, gyproc, cement, steel or wood
- Building/demolition material
- Liquids
- Uncontained animal waste
- Any hazardous or noxious matter
- Electronics
- Clean wood

# RECYCLING COLLECTION

## RECYCLING IS COLLECTED BI-WEEKLY

**TIP: All recyclables should be clean and empty**

## RECYCLING GUIDELINES

- Rinse containers clean, flatten boxes and remove lids.
- If you have additional recycling, please use additional water resistant bins and sort as per the guidelines

### Mixed Paper

#### Clean, dry mixed paper and cardboard

Box Board, Catalogues, Cereal and other food boxes, Coloured Paper, Corrugated Cardboard (flattened) Envelopes, Flyer Inserts, Glossy paper, Greeting Cards, Junk Mail, Magazines, Newspapers, Paper Bags, Paper Egg Cartons, Paper Plates, Cups (clean), Shredded paper, Tissue Boxes, Wrapping Paper (not foil type).



### Plastic

Jars, jugs, lids, plant pots, bottles and prescription containers.



### Metal

Beverage cans, tin foil wrap, foil trays and plates, aerosol spray cans (household products only), tin cans.



## NOT ACCEPTED X

- Glass
- Food waste
- Block foam
- Tissue or paper towels
- Fabric
- Appliances
- Paint cans
- Batteries
- Plastic wrap
- Plastic bags
- Bubble wrap
