

RECYCLING

Empty and rinse containers out. Place loose in cart.



Clean paper and cardboard

- Newspaper
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Magazines and Catalogs
- Telephone Books
- Printer Paper
- Junk Mail
- Cereal and Pop Boxes
- Shoe Boxes
- Non-Coated Paper Products



Flatten and cut cardboard to fit into the cart with the lid shut

Clean, empty glass bottles and jars

No caps or lids. Labels OK.



Clean metal

- Aluminum Cans
- Tin, Steel and Metal Cans
- Aerosol Cans (empty, no lids or tips)
- Small Pieces of Scrap Metal (not sharp or greasy 2'x2'x2' 35lbs max)



Clean plastic

Plastic Bottles, Jugs and Tubs. No caps or lids.



Recycling Tips

All recyclables should be placed in your Blue Cart.



There is no limit on recycling. Put extra recyclables in a clearly labeled kraft bag, cardboard box or 32-gallon container with handles and lid. Please label "Recycle."

YARD AND FOOD DEBRIS

All of these items can go into your yard and food debris cart. Please see attached calendar for details about your yard debris collection.

Food scraps and leftovers

All these items can be composted in your yard and food debris cart.



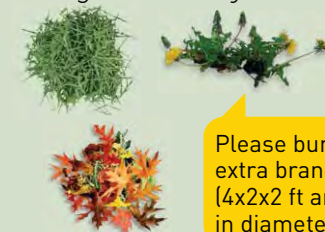
Food-soiled paper

- Paper Towels
- Napkins
- Food-Soiled Paper Bags
- Greasy Pizza Boxes
- Tea Bags, Coffee Grounds and Filters



Yard trimmings

- Leaves, Grass, Plant Trimmings
- Branches and Christmas Trees (must be undecorated, unflocked, cut into 4 foot lengths and fit in your cart)



Please bundle extra branches (4x2x2 ft and 4 in diameter limit).

Extra Yard Trimmings

There is a charge for extra yard trimmings. Place extras next to your yard debris cart and at least 3 feet from your garbage cart.



Put extra yard trimmings in:

- Cans with handles, marked "yard debris" (32 gal., 65 lb. limit)
- Kraft paper bags labeled "yard debris"
- An extra yard debris cart (available for a fee)

KEEP OUT OF YARD AND FOOD DEBRIS

- Twine
- Plastic Bags & Containers
- Fats, Oil or Grease
- Glass
- Metal & Foil
- Concrete
- Liquids
- Diapers & Pet Waste
- Garden Hoses
- Dirt, Sod & Rocks

GARBAGE

These items are neither recyclable, compostable, nor hazardous. Please put them in your garbage cart.



Non-recyclable plastic

All these items go into your garbage cart.



Glass

- Window Panes, Mirrors
- Ceramics, Dishware, Broken Glass
- Standard Light Bulbs



Non-recyclable paper

- Non-Food Soiled Paper Towels
- Shiny, Coated or Foil Paper
- Hardcover Books (donate to a charity or school)



Non-recyclable metal

- Latex Paint Cans (harden paint with kitty litter or paint hardener, then place in garbage)
- Lids and Caps
- Sharp Metal
- Small Appliances (donate to a charity if working)



Garbage Tips and Guidelines

Please use WM provided cart.

- Please bag all garbage.
- Double bag pet waste, packing pellets, vacuum dust, sawdust, and cold ashes.
- Weight limit: 70 lbs/35-gal cart for your collector's safety.
- Garbage charges are based on container size. There may be an extra charge when the material amount causes the cart lid to be raised more than 6 inches.



Annual Curbside Cleanup

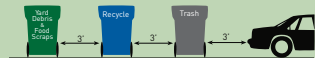

CONTAINER SET OUT GUIDELINES



Please Allow Adequate Spacing Around Your Carts.

Your recycling cart will be collected every-other-week on your garbage collection day.

- Place carts at the curb by 6 a.m.
- Place carts three (3) feet apart with lids opening toward the street.
- Place carts at least three (3) feet from obstructions such as cars, trees, utility boxes, fences and mailboxes. Our trucks need clear access to service the carts.
- Place wheels as close to the curb as possible.

Waste Management is able to provide service in most weather conditions.

In an event of extreme inclement weather event, visit servicealerts.wmnorthwest.com to learn about any weather-related service delays. Receive real-time service updates by enrolling in text message and email alerts at wm.com/preferences

If weather conditions prevent safe collection, up to twice as much garbage, recyclables and yard debris will be collected at no extra charge on your next regular collection day. No credits will be issued for collection delays due to weather.
