

King County residents receive weekly garbage service. Recycling is collected

every other week. Yard waste service is available by subscription.

Please follow these guidelines to ensure collection.

Please place carts at the curb by 6 am

- . Two (2) feet apart with lids opening toward street . At least three (3) feet from cars, trees, mailboxes and utility boxes
- · Wheels as close to the road as possible
- Please remove carts as soon as possible after collection.
- . Do not overstuff your carts. All materials must fall freely into the truck


