

MIXED RECYCLING

All recyclables must be empty, clean and loose

Scappoose residents can mix all paper, cardboard, metal and plastic bottles in their recycling carts. Only glass needs to be recycled separately.



Following the guidelines of what is allowed in your recycling bin saves natural resources, reduces pollution and creates jobs.

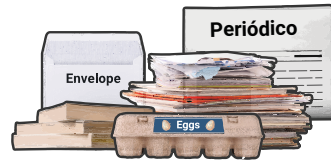
Cardboard and Cartons



Flattened cardboard, packaging boxes, food and beverage cartons

Pizza boxes must be empty with no food residue.

Paper



Newspaper, magazines, office paper, egg cartons, mail, paperback books, bags, and non-metallic gift wrap

Plastic



Bottles, round containers, buckets, and rigid plant pots

Caps OK if screwed on.
All items must be 2 inches by 2 inches or larger.

Metal



Metal cans, foil, empty aerosols, scrap metal, and empty paint cans

Glass



Bottles and jars
Remove caps and lids.

Place in glass only bin

No!



No bagged recyclables



No batteries



No food or liquid
(empty all containers)



No plastic bags or stretchy plastics
(store or depot drop-off)



No hoses, cords, or wires



YARD DEBRIS

These items go in your yard debris cart

KEEP OUT of Yard Debris

- ✗ Food
- ✗ Diapers
- ✗ Pet Waste/Litter
- ✗ Plastic Bags
- ✗ Metal
- ✗ Cooking Oils
- ✗ Glass
- ✗ Hoses
- ✗ Tarps
- ✗ Plastic Twine



Yard Trimmings

Branches • Houseplants • Garden vegetation
Grass and leaves • Weeds and prunings
Undecorated holiday trees

Extra Yard Debris

There is a charge for extra yard trimmings.

Put extra trimmings in:

- Carts with handles (35 gal, 70lb limit)
- Kraft paper yard bags
- Bundle extra branches (4x2x2 ft. limit)

Label carts or paper bags "Yard" and put them at least 3 feet from Yard Debris Cart.

COLLECTION GUIDELINES

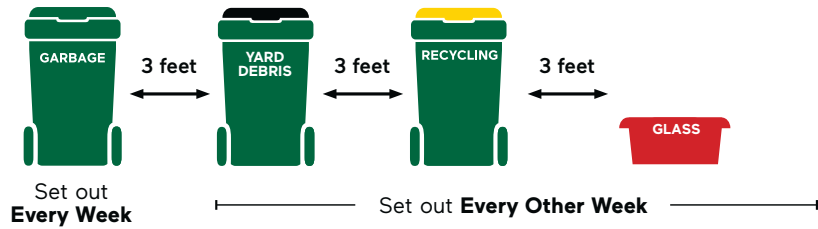
Scappoose residents receive weekly garbage service. Recycling is collected every other week. Yard waste service is available by subscription.

Please follow these guidelines to ensure collection.

- Please place containers at the curb by **6 am**.
- Three (3) feet apart with lids opening toward street
 - At least three (3) feet from cars, trees, mailboxes
 - Wheels as close to the road as possible
 - Please remove containers as soon as possible after collection
 - Do not overstuff your carts. All materials must fall freely into the truck

Maximum allowable weights:

- 20-gallon cart – 35 lbs
- 35-gallon cart – 70 lbs
- 64-gallon cart – 120 lbs
- 96-gallon cart – 145 lbs
