

Recycling Beyond the Curb

Many items are recyclable, but don't belong in your curbside recycling cart. Here are some recycling options for a variety of materials.

WHAT DO I DO WITH...

Motor Oil

Put in tightly closed 1 gallon plastic jugs and take to a hazardous waste station.



Search "transfer stations" for locations and quantity limitations.

Light Bulbs + Fluorescent Tubes





Refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, clothes washers, dryers, stoves, ranges, furnaces, etc.*



Sell, donate or give away

*Washers, dryers, stoves, ranges, dishwashers, microwaves and hot water tanks (that are 85% metal or more), may be recycled at the Snohomish County transfer stations.

Appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, heat pumps and dehumidifiers contain chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs), which are regulated under the Federal Clean Air Act, and must be disposed of properly.
