• Garbage charges are based on container size. There is a charge for extra garbage that doesn't fit in your container with the lid closed. The weight limit for extra garbage is 70 lbs (35-gal) for your collector's safety.

Compost Tips:

- In your kitchen, gather food scraps in a bucket, reusable container with a lid or a paper bag.
- · Empty into your outdoor yard/food cart frequently.
- · Layer food scraps with yard waste or used paper towels to absorb liquids.

Extra Yard Waste:

There is a charge for extra yard waste that doesn't fit in your container with the lid closed

Put extra yard waste only in:

- Containers with handles (35 gal., 70 lb. limit)
- · Label containers "Yard"
- · Bundle tied with twine (4'x2' limit)
- · Reusable polywoven or paper yard bags

COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Your garbage and yard & food waste containers will be collected weekly. Recycling will be collected every other week on your garbage day.

Please follow these guidelines to ensure collection.

Place containers at the curb by 6 am.

- Place containers at least two (2) feet apart from each other and three (3) feet away from all obstructions such as cars, trees, fences and mailboxes.
- Place wheels as close to the curb as possible.
- Remove containers as soon as possible after collection.





HAVE PLASTIC BAGS TO RECYCLE?

Many grocery stores accept used plastic bags for recycling. Contact your local store for more information!
