Mandatory Recycling

- City Code 19.125.150(7)(h) requires residents to recycle, and properties to offer as much recycling service as garbage service. Request assistance and/ or use resources listed in this guide to come into compliance.
- Recycling services are provided by WM at no cost to properties. Multifamily properties may have as much recycling service as their base garbage service.

Illegal Dumping and Theft of Services

- "Illegal dumping" is garbage being placed on the ground instead of a container, regardless of who does it. If reported, Code Compliance will require the property owner to arrange for clean up.
- "Theft of service" is off-site material getting dumped in your garbage container without your permission (stealing your garbage service).
- Do not confront the suspect.



Save Time and Money

Garbage charges vary by size of container and number of pickups.



- Right size your container and frequency of pickup so material doesn't get left on the ground.
- Garbage and recycling containers must be located together and be no more than 150 feet from any residential building for easy resident access. (As required by FWRC 19.125.150.)
- Consider contracting out garbage enclosure monitoring and maintenance.
- Request slotted lids for recycling containers to reduce contamination.
- Instruct residents to flatten boxes.

Keep Enclosures Clean

Garbage trucks cannot pick up bulky items. WM offers a separate fee-based bulky item pick up service.

Hazardous waste is banned from garbage/recycling containers.

- Right size your container and frequency of pickup to avoid charges for extra set-outs.
- Close container lids to deter pests and keep rainwater from entering your container.
- Request free replacement of broken/damaged WM containers and lids.
- Pick up any litter or debris around containers frequently.
- Remove bulky items and hazardous waste from enclosures.
- Install cameras to monitor enclosures and institute fines to deter illegal dumping.

RECYCLING



Help residents Recycle Right[®]. Make sure only the items listed below go in the **blue** container.

Mandatory Recycling: The City of Federal Way requires all multifamily properties to recycle. WM wants to help you meet these requirements. Questions? Email us at **recyclenw@wm.com** or call 253-833-3333.

Metal

ALUMINUM & TIN CANS

Place tin lids in can, crimp shut.



Small, non-working metal appliances, pots, tools, etc. Limit 2' x 2' x 2', 35lbs; no wood, plastic or rubber attachments; no sharp metal.

Glass

JARS & BOTTLES (ALL COLORS ACCEPTED)

Only bottles and jars—no other types or shapes of glass are allowed.

Paper and Cardboard

CLEAN & DRY

Most types of paper and cardboard are accepted, as long as it is clean and dry. Instruct residents to flatten boxes.

Plastic

BOTTLES, JUGS & TUBS

Only recycle these "shapes" of plastic containers—do not worry about the recycling symbol or number.

NO PLASTIC BAGS

FREE RECYCLING TOTE BAGS

These totes are great to give to your residents for collecting and carrying to the recycling container.

SLOTTED RECYCLING LIDS

Slotted lids decrease garbage, bagged material and other non-recyclable items from going in the recycling.

The lids lock shut with a notched slot opening.

RECYCLING TIPS

Clean • Empty • Loose

Valet Services may be used at your property. Valet Services use plastic bags to

Services use plastic bags to collect materials. However, materials in plastic bags do not get recycled at recycling facilities. If your property hires a contractor to collect recycling in plastic bags at each residence, make sure they understand this rule and empty all materials out of bags into your containers. Another option is to instruct residents to self-haul recycling to containers.

Empty and rinse out all food residue. Labels do not need to be removed.



Remind residents that no plastic "recycling bags" or garbage bags are allowed in the recycling. Residents should empty clean recyclables out of bags and boxes into dumpsters so they can be easily sorted.

The numbers no longer matter.

Recycle plastic only if it is a bottle, jug or tub.

No plastic bags, plant pots, soil, sod, rocks, liquids, shredded paper or pet waste.

Setting up a Successful Yard+Food Waste Collection Program

- 1 Identify where you can add a yard+food waste cart. We recommend one 96-gallon yard+food waste cart for every 100 units. Yard+food waste carts should be placed next to the garbage and recycling containers.
- Consider whether your property is ready to begin yard+food waste. If your property experiences frequently contaminated recycling, it is best to focus on helping your residents recycle right.
- Assess resident interest. Reach out to residents to determine whether a yard+food waste program is something that would be used at your property.



Recommended Waste Enclosure Layout

Place yard+food waste cart next to garbage and recycling.

Clearly label all waste containers.

- Contact WM at 253-833-3333 to sign up for service. You can cancel yard+food waste service at any time.
- Educate and motivate residents. Communicate with residents what can be included in the yard+food waste program through an email, letter, and/or meeting. Consider setting aside time for a kickoff meeting or open house event to answer questions about the new program.
- Orient new residents. At move-in, explain the yard+food waste program to new residents and provide copies of guides (available at wmnorthwest.com/federalway/apartments).
- Track how the yard+food waste program is going. Is the yard+food waste cart being used? Keep an eye on what is ending up in the yard+food waste cart and communicate with residents when the wrong materials are being put in.

Double bag pet waste, vacuum dust, sawdust and cold ashes.



DO NOT put liquids, yard waste, hazardous waste, batteries or recycling in the garbage.



Recycle Right. See results in your bill: The value of materials recycled will be credited back to Federal Way businesses on the garbage bill. This will change annually based on the amount of correctly recycled materials by all of Federal Way. Make sure to recycle only plastic bottles, jugs and tubs; tin cans, aluminum cans, scrap metal, paper, and cardboard and that all materials are clean and dry, and free from foods and liquids.
