KEEP OUT of Yard & Food Waste

- Plastic Bags
- Fats, Oils + Grease
- Diapers
- Pet Waste
- Liquids
- Glass
- Metal
- Garden Hoses

Compost Tips:

- In your kitchen, gather food scraps in a colander or strainer, reusable container with a lid or a paper bag.
- Empty into your outdoor yard/food cart frequently.
- Layer food scraps with yard waste or newspaper to absorb liquids.

Extra Yard Waste:

- There is a charge for extra yard waste that doesn't fit in your container with the lid closed.
- Put extra yard waste only in:
- Cans with handles (35 gal., 70 lb. limit)
 - Label cans "Yard"
 - Bundle tied with twine (4'x2' limit)
 - Paper leaf bags

RECYCLING

Please do not bag. Place these loose items in your recycling cart.
Recyclables should be empty, clean & loose.

Extra Recycling
You can set out extra recycling on collection day for a charge. Set out extras in a 35-gallon personal can labeled 'Recycle' or cardboard boxes (limit 2'x2'x2').

Materials placed in a plastic bag cannot be sorted at the recycle center and do not get recycled.

Everything you put in your recycling cart should be:
Empty, Clean, Loose

- Give food containers a quick rinse.
- Ensure items are empty of liquids.
- Keep recyclables out of bags and boxes.

Garbage Guidelines

- Please bag all garbage.
- Double bag pet waste, pet litter, packing pellets, vacuum dust, sawdust, and cold ashes.

Extra Garbage:

Garbage charges are based on container size. There is a charge for extra garbage that doesn't fit in your container with the lid closed. Bulky items like mattresses, appliances, and building materials can be picked up by special arrangement for a fee. Call WM customer service at 1-800-592-9995 to schedule collection.

COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Please follow these guidelines to ensure collection.

Place containers at the curb by 6 am.

- Place containers at least three (3) feet apart from each other and away from all obstructions such as cars, trees, fences, and mailboxes.
- Place containers with lids opening toward the street.
- Take containers in as soon as possible.



WHAT DO I DO WITH...?

Some items are not allowed in garbage or recycling.



Motor Oil

Households may dispose of up to five gallons of motor oil at any of the Skagit County Recycling Sites. Visit skagitcounty.net for more information.



Electronics

Large Appliances

Refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, clothes washers, dryers, stoves, ranges, furnaces, etc. may be disposed of or recycled at Mt. Vernon Solid Waste facilities.
