Redeem Oregon beverage containers at redemption centers, retailers, or grocery stores.

Many mattresses and box springs can be recycled for free at participating locations.

More than a dozen free drop-off locations in and around Beaverton.

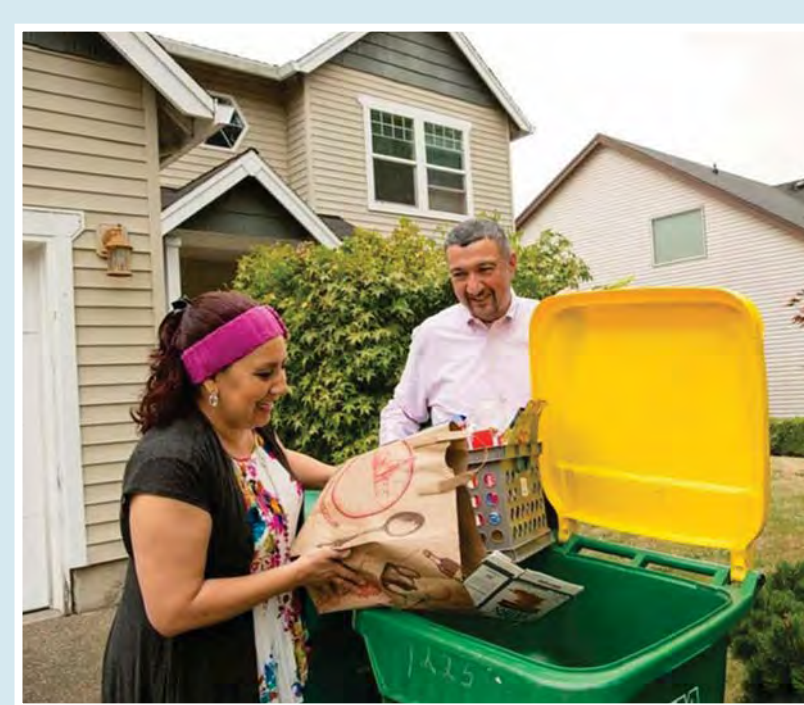

RECYCLE RIGHT: 2026 Quick Guide

Beaverton wants you to recycle right by placing only approved items in your recycling bin.

All items must be empty, clean, and dry. Place recyclables loose in your bin, never in bags.

RECYCLING Paper, Plastic & Metal



- **Plastic bottles, round containers, buckets, and rigid plant pots.** Caps OK if screwed on. All items must be 2x2 inches or larger.
- **Metal cans, foil, scrap metal, paint cans, and empty aerosols.**
- **Flattened cardboard boxes and food and beverage cartons.**
- **Paper, newspaper, magazines, egg cartons, mail, paperback books, non-metallic gift wrap, and pizza delivery boxes without food or greasy liners.**



GLASS

Bottles, Jars & Batteries



Glass bottles and jars. No caps, lids, lightbulbs, ceramics, or broken glass.



Batteries



Alkaline, button cell, and rechargeable batteries. Tape ends of all batteries, except alkaline. Put in a one-quart, zip-sealed plastic bag and place on top of the glass recycling. Single-family customers only.



MOTOR OIL



Set motor oil next to the glass recycling bin in a clear plastic jug with a lid. Use a one-gallon, see-through, break-resistant bottle with a screw top lid. Single-family customers only.



COMPOST

Food & Yard Waste



Food scraps, yard debris, food-soiled napkins and paper towels, tea bags, and coffee filters.

KEEP OUT!

These items should never be placed in recycling, glass, or compost bins.

- **Plastic bags or stretchy plastics**
- **Electronics**
- **Batteries** (except single-family glass recycling allowable)
- **Tanglers** (hoses, cords, or wires)
- **Clothing and textiles** (curtains, rugs)
- **Block packing foam, packaging/foam peanuts, and foam food containers**
- **Compostable containers and utensils**
- **Pet Waste**
