Garbage Guidelines

- Please bag all garbage.
- Double bag pet waste, pet litter, packing pellets, vacuum dust, sawdust and cold ashes.

Extra Garbage:

Garbage charges are based on cart size. If your garbage cart lid is open more than 6 inches, there will be a charge for extra garbage.

Bulky items such as mattresses, large appliances and building materials can be picked up by special arrangement for a fee. Contact us for fee information.

What do I do with...?

Plastic bags

Bag plastic bags together and take them to your local grocery store for recycling, reuse them or put them in the garbage.

Hardcover books
Donate them to a school or charity.

Paint

Paintcare is a new resource for free drop off! Visit paintcare.org/states/washington/ for more information on the program. If you can't drop off latex paint for recycling, mix in cat litter, shredded paper, or sawdust to solidify. Once dry, bag it and place it in your garbage.

Shredded paper

Use to soak up and harden latex paint in the garbage. In order to recycle shredded paper and documents to shred, take them to a shred event.



Batteries are not garbage! Do not throw batteries in the garbage. Take batteries for disposal to a hazardous waste collection facility.

Compost Tips:

- In your kitchen, gather food scraps in a colander or strainer, reusable container with a lid or a paper bag.
- Empty into your outdoor yard/food cart frequently.
- Layer food scraps with yard waste or newspaper to absorb liquids.

Extra Yard Waste:

There is a charge for extra yard waste that doesn't fit in your container with the lid closed. Put extra yard waste only in:

- Cans with handles (35 gal., 70 lb. limit)
- Label cans "Yard"
- Bundle tied with twine (4"x2" limit)
- Paper leaf bags

COLLECTION GUIDELINES

King County residents receive weekly garbage service. Recycling is collected every other week. Yard waste service is available by subscription.

Please follow these guidelines to ensure collection.

Please place carts at the curb by **6 am**

- Two (2) feet apart with lids opening toward street
- At least three (3) feet from cars, trees, mailboxes and utility boxes
- Wheels as close to the road as possible
- Please remove carts as soon as possible after collection
- Do not overstuff your carts. All materials must fall freely into the truck

Maximum allowable weights:

- 20-gallon cart – 35 lbs
- 35-gallon cart – 70 lbs
- 64-gallon cart – 120 lbs
- 96-gallon cart – 145 lbs
